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Personal Profile

I am a loyal, highly motivated, positive, efficient, and mature team member, with an inquiring mind. Professionalism, positivity and accountability, with a focus on safety and individuality, are priorities to me. I strive to be an advocate for the patients/service users I care for, at all times, and have an enthusiasm for achieving quality for service users and staff. I am creative and relish the challenge of managing new projects. I have a sense of humour, and get pleasure from being surrounded by social, investigative and enterprising people.

I have been an active member of the Development Group for Spinal Cord Injury (SCI) providing input on the WHO's Package of Interventions for Rehabilitation as well as the WHO SCI Emergency Response Standard Guidelines. At present I am a member of The International Spinal Cord Society (ISCoS) Toolkit Working Group, focusing on 'data management' globally.

I was part of the NHS Covid-19 pandemic mass vaccination programme along with medico-legal work as an expert witness with Tessa Gough & Associates and enjoy using my analytical clinical skills, acting for the claimant or NHS Trust, writing reports relating to Breach of Duty and Causation. Until recently, I was Registered Service Manager at the Livability Spinal Injury Centre, set in the heart of Dorset countryside. This was a brand new service filling a large gap in care for people adjusting and adapting following a life changing injury. My role includes management and teaching; Working with the team, we set up a safe, caring, responsive, effective and well led service, and rated 'overall Good' by The Care Quality Commission. We also achieved the top 5 star rating award by the local Environmental Health Department. We were successful in bidding for a tender for 10 beds for people who have sustained a SCI. In the past, I have worked at The South West Region SCI Centre, as a Nurse Specialist providing acute outreach assessments of newly injured people within the South West Region. I also worked in the acute admissions and rehabilitation wards caring for ventilated and non-ventilated patients and provided education to staff, students, patients, families and carers. I was the Specialist Spinal Nurse at The BMI Winterbourne, Dorchester, where I introduced and established this new role within the multi-disciplinary team to enhance the holistic care of patients undergoing spinal surgery. This was an autonomous role, and the feedback was extremely positive; I was able to create staff and patient spinal specific education sessions, information leaflets, discharge letter templates and telephone assessment algorithms.

I had the honour of accepting a fellowship, awarded by the Royal College of Nursing (RCN), which is the highest award created by the RCN for 'exceptional and outstanding contribution to the science and art of nursing' in 2016. This principally related to my involvement in SCI healthcare capacity building and clinical/organisational management following two sudden onset disasters (Haiti and Nepal) and long term development involvement thereafter in low and middle income countries. I was a Finalist in the Nursing Times Nurse of the Year section and received the Cavell Nurse's Trust 'International Impact Award' in 2017. In 2018, I was awarded a 'Points of Light' by the UK Prime Minister in recognition of 'exceptional service supporting people with spinal cord injuries'.

As a member of ISCoS Education & Disaster Committees, for 6 years, I had the opportunity to present and provide workshops for the inter-professional team in other countries, and am a contributor to some of the www.elearnsci.org nursing modules as well as 'Overview for whole team. Sub section; Management of SCI after disasters and emergencies' and 'Consumer Module. Sub section; Skin management'.

Progressing spinal cord injury nursing and healthcare capacity building is a passion of mine and I avidly support 'healthcare information for all'. I co-founded The International Network of SCI Nurses with the aim of providing freely available SCI resources to enhance best practice, co-ordinate The Judy Waterlow Pressure Ulcer Prevention Treatment Policy organisation, and have created, established and coordinate two websites; www.scinurse.org and www.haitisci.org. My research activities have been extremely interesting and have related to low and middle income country SCI care. Our three year follow up study relating to people who had sustained a SCI in the earthquake (Haiti 2010), was presented at the 2013 ISCoS annual conference. A 7 year follow up study of SCI earthquake survivors was presented at the 2017 ISCoS conference along with a presentation on the impact of a hurricane on the SCI population in Haiti. In 2023 I was SCI Nurse Consultant to Momentum Non Government Organisation (NGO) in Ukraine and provided theoretical and practical training to the multidisciplinary team to support the introduction and roll out of SCI rehabilitation in Country.

Finally, I have had the honour of working with The World Health Organisation as a core member of the Rehabilitation Foreign Medical Team Working Group in 2015 and 2017. Our work resulted in the WHO Minimum Standards for Rehabilitation Emergency Medical Teams publication 'Development and implementation of the World Health Organization Emergency medical teams: Minimum technical standards and recommendations for rehabilitation'.
